Officer Reports

President: Wayne announced that the SEAHO business meeting would be the next day in 107A and B. He encouraged everyone to go to the social that night. He talked about the positive experience at WKU for KSLC. He has several ideas for checking the pulse from the housing offices, including; assessment, conferences, creating accountability, feedback, etc. If anyone is interested please sign up to join the Getting Better Task Force. He discussed that he would be recruiting more leadership at KAHO fall 2011 conference. The open positions would be small school and grad reps, as well as President-Elect. Wayne also announced that the SEAHO scholarship recipients were Janelle Briscoe from Bellarmine and Oby Sanders from EKU.

President-Elect: Emily Jo explained she was excited to be here. She announced that KRACLE would be at EKU. She can't wait to see everyone at the social.

Colonel: Steve explained his role is to advise the board. He is the keeper of the constitution. He also helps maintain the state listserv.

Secretary/Treasurer: Balance in the account is \$1107.00

State Representative: David thanked the state for allowing him to serve. He stated that Ann would take over the next day. David discussed the changes SEAHO is making in the state rep position. SEAHO has asked states to adopt a generic job description if we choose to keep the state editor position. He provided us with the basic guidelines for the state rep from SEAHO. David shared that this would be his last year on faculty for RELI. He discussed that KAHO has scholarships for RELI and that those are awarded after you have been accepted. The KY/GA social will be at 9 p.m. in the Riverboat Room. David gave KAHO recognition for having presented 4-5 programs at the conference. He issued a challenge to the state to submit more programs, collaborate with other schools, and to use the KAHO conference as a practice run. He also deferred to Ann for an announcement. Ann issued the awards from SEAHO. April Barnes from EKU, JT Stinnett from U of L and Rafael Forti from Union all received service awards. Ann encouraged each institution to submit them because each school is allowed to receive one.

State Editor: Aubree is excited to be the state editor. She requested that each school send her articles and institutional updates to submit for SEAHO. She told the membership that the next submission deadline is March 21. She would like to see them prior to that to allow time for editing. The SEAHO report will be on line from now on and will be published 3 times per year, Winter, Summer and Fall

Murray: 2 AD positions potential open. :They are working on a plan with budgets and closing one hall. They need to renovate 5 high rise buildings.

Northern: 2 GA positions and 2 anticipated Hall Director positions.

Uk: New VP has issued a re-organization. New Hall construction set to begin on North Campus.

U of L: Will have 3 GA positions, a Full-time Coordinator and RLC position open. They will be at SPE/TPE. New affiliated building on line this coming fall with 358 beds. We are working on a web/self-assignment for students. 2nd year with combined business operations with A and O.

Sullivan: 412 beds. New construction set to begin this week. Hall Director position open.

WKU: We will have open positions. They will be posted at OPE and SPE. Breaking ground on student apartments.

Announcements:

Shannon: ACUHO-I will be doing 3 opportunities for service in New Orleans this summer. It's not too late to submit programs. Other ways to participate through committees and task forces. Starz applications are open. Shannon on faculty for NHTI. RELI is taking applications.

Old Business: KRACLE 2012 will be at EKU via the KARH bidding process. KRACLE stands for Kentucky Resident Affiliates Conference ^{for} ~~Leadership~~. We are concerned with preserving opportunities for the RAs and the RSA/RHAs. Wayne seeks a motion to accept EKU has host and to continue moving forward with KRACLE and not a separate RA conference.

David from WKU motions and Richard from NKU 2nds, all in favor.

Shannon from U of L suggests we have an oversight committee.

Lindsey from WKU states that we should consider a KRACLE Board and a task force to look at feasibility of a board. She has evaluations and will get the results out to KAHO.

April from EKU stated that each school had a split delegation. Some of the KRAC schools did not participate.

Shannon from U of L explained the difficulty of having caps.

Lindsey from WKU discussed that they had planned on 250 but only 134 came.

NKU offered that they selected delegation members via an application process.

U of L only used the cap for RA positions. Struggle with how many RAs vs. RSA members to send because of the cap.

Steve asked why KRACLE?

Lindsey from WKU stated it came from Mini-KARH

Steve is concerned with becoming over acronymed. Brian agreed.

David from WKU suggested that KSLC gives it more professionalism and feels like even playing ground for the both groups. Discussion was continued about having tracks that are position specific. The group was encouraged to think outside the box. WKU offered to help EKU with schedule/programming.

Steve stated that KRAC was seen as a "joke" and there is an issue of respect with naming conferences.

Lindsey offered that they would have considered 2 tracks but that the number of program submissions was very low.

Shannon suggested a task force to be created. David agreed.
