5) School Reports

- a) Bellarmine University – recently named a new President; will be hiring for a new full-time Residence Life Coordinator for the fall; currently hiring for a part-time position; recently completed student staff selection
- b) Berea College – construction being completed and new building will be coming on-line; co-hosting Kentucky Association of Blacks in Higher Education conference (March 30 – April 1) with Eastern Kentucky University
- c) Eastern Kentucky University – currently hiring for 4 graduate and 3 full-time positions; will be opening 2 new halls; soon opening or re-opening new dining hall, student center and recreation facility; co-hosting KABHE conference with Berea College
- d) Georgetown College – celebrating having a full residence life staff; had largest freshman class in years; will be having a Diversity & Inclusion position open for applications
- e) Lindsey Wilson College – currently maintaining goodness; potential full-time openings in the future
- f) Midway University – starting enrolling men this academic year; new Director and Assistant Director in housing; currently looking to re-establish what Midway looks like; men's sports teams are doing well
- g) Morehead State University – officially opened new residence hall in November; recently hired full-time Hall Director for fall; recently hired ACUHO-I Intern for Summer
- h) Murray State University – No Report

- i) Spalding University – school leadership is behind importance of on-campus living experience; recently implemented live-on requirement; first-year students live in single hall
- j) Transylvania University – moved residents into 2 new halls in January and subsequently closed 2 halls; recent changes include addition of a new Director and current Assistant Director transitioning to another role on campus
- k) University of Kentucky – recent creation of Division of Student & Academic Life; currently exploring Residence Life's place in campus structure; Student Center currently under construction should open in 2018; last of 2 new halls will open in the fall, including apartment and graduate housing; adding LLPs for Cats for Recovery and International Village; completing hiring for RAs, 3 new graduate HD, 5 professional RD, and Area Coordinator positions
- l) University of Louisville – completing RA selection, including introducing Senior RA position; will be adding ~2,000 beds to system; will be posting new positions soon; student activities center under construction
- m) Western Kentucky University – new Director/AVP-SA; Dr. Golston recently left for another position, so conduct position will be opening soon; recently broke ground on new hall
- n) Centre College – record enrollment; currently renovating spaces for additional occupancy; recently opened new soccer complex; completing RA selection; Director of Residence Life and Director of Greek Life & Orientation openings accepting applications

- a) Branding Survey Updates
 - i) Overall response indicated that members like the logo and can access website resources
 - ii) Respondents indicated that there was a lack of understanding of the KAHO Chronicle blog
 - (1) KAHO newsletter that was recently transitioned to a blog format to allow for regular and easy contribution and updating
 - iii) Will be consulting marketing professionals from around the state to determine ways that the logo can be made more accessible and user-friendly
